### 9<sup>TH</sup> GRADE

#### FALL

- Begin planning high school curriculum with college entrance requirements in mind

### 10<sup>TH</sup> GRADE

#### FALL

- Refine high school curriculum plan
- Begin considering and evaluating college credit choices (CLEP, Early College, etc.)

#### SPRING

- Begin registration planning for college credit choices for junior year
- Research extracurricular experiences

- Register for PSAT normally taken fall of junior year

### 11<sup>TH</sup> GRADE

#### FALL

- Take PSAT
- Begin college search process: Gather information on colleges to narrow your options and plan to visit your top choices
- Sign up to take SAT/ACT/CLT in the spring

#### SPRING

- Begin visiting colleges (*If you plan to go to community college first, you can still visit colleges and ask about transfer policies and Articulation Agreements.*)
- Take SAT/ACT/CLT

- Sign up to take fall SAT/ACT/CLT

- Continue college visits

### 12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE

#### FALL

- Take SAT/ACT/CLT again, if needed
- Make final college visits
- Make a master calendar for admissions and financial aid deadlines
- Pull tax information together and complete FAFSA

- Send in applications for admission

#### WINTER

- Research scholarships and grants

#### SPRING

- Evaluate offers of admission and financial aid
- Choose your college: Pay enrollment and housing deposits by deadlines stated
- Complete any additional paperwork required by the college
