General Notes

- Check Degree Works or the Catalog for course pre-requisite information.
- Minimum C- grade for major coursework required
- 50% of major requirements must be taken at Regent University
- A minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA is required to maintain good academic standing.
- Some majors also require a minimum grade in all major courses.
- As a general rule, 100 and 200 level courses should be taken prior to upper level (300 and 400) level courses.
- A minimum of 123 credits is required.
- A minor may be completed in place of a portion of the general electives. Students must still earn 123 credits total.
- Honors & on campus students will have 15 less general elective credits due to taking the C&C minor or Honors courses.
- Transfer or PLA credits may not be used for MUSC courses.
- A successful entrance audition is required for entry into the B.M. in Classical Voice.
